Minutes of the 24th Executive Committee (EC) Meeting of the State Health Society, Assam of National Health Mission (NHM) held at NHM Conference Hall on 18.02.2022 at 4 p.m

The 24th Executive Committee meeting of the State Health Society (SHS), NHM, Assam was held on 18.02.2022 at the NHM Conference Hall under the Chairmanship of Shri Anuarg Goel, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Assam.

Agenda points:-

- 1. Discussion on draft PIP proposal for the FY 2022-24 and Planning process adopted
- 2. Discussion on draft proposal under XV Finance Commission Health Grant
- 3. Discussion on draft proposal under PM-ABHIM
- Other decision points
- 5. Any other issues with the permission of the chairman.

The meeting started with the welcome address to all the members by Dr. Lakshmanan S, IAS, Mission Director, NHM Assam.

The list of the members, who attended the meeting is annexed at Annexure-I. The detailed presentation made on NHM PIP for FY 2022-23 & 2023-24 at Annexure-II.

Members had threadbare discussion on the agenda points and the following decisions were taken:

Agenda Point- 1: Discussion on draft PIP proposal for the FY 2022-24 and planning process adopted.

The primary agenda of the meeting was to apprise all the members of the Executive Committee about the State Program Implementation Plan (SPIP) for 2 years 2022-23 and 2023-24 and to seek approval for the same so as to submit the SPIP before the Governing Body (GB) for their kind approval and finally submitting the SPIP to Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India.

The meeting noted the financial progress made under NHM, Assam during current FY.

MD, NHM gave an insight into the gist of the SPIP for 2 years 2022-23 and 2023-24, through a detailed presentation and also spoke about the special points of this year SPIP preparation, Conditionality Framework of FY 2022-24, Key Deliverables, planning process adopted during preparation of PIP under which state is submitting SPIP for 2 years (2022-23, 2023-24).

MD, NHM informed that from the coming financial year, there will not be any carrying forward of uncommitted and unspent expenditure and no supplementary PIP can be submitted, unless Ministry asks for the same. After a threadbare discussion of different proposals, a few suggestions/observations were put forwarded by the Chairman and other members. These are to be incorporated in the SPIP and the revised SPIP will be submitted before the Governing Body on 21.02.2022 for its approval for onward submission of the SPIP 2021-22 to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India at the earliest.



The Executive Committee approved all the proposals of the SPIP with a suggestion for few minor modifications in the PIP. The Resolutions of the meeting as agreed upon are stated below:

The EC meeting recommended one 100 bedded Critical Care under PM-ABHIM to takeup in advance at Kamrup district in the FY 2022-23 instead of FY 2025-26.

The Chairman, EC suggested the PM-ABHIM proposals to place before the Governing Body for approval for onward submission to the MoH&FW, GoI.

Agenda Point - 4:- Other decision points

4.1:- Reallocation of fund for release of Untied Grant - 2021-22.

Executive Committee recommended the reallocation proposal for release of Untied Grant to the health facilities (District Hospitals, SDCHs, CHC/Model Hospitals, PHCs/UPHC) amounting to Rs. 1108.22 lakh for the FY 2021-22 from saving of different FMR codes.

4.2:- Proposal for enhancement of remuneration of Specialist Doctors/ PG Doctors under NHM

Executive Committee recommended revision of initial pay of Specialist Doctors to Rs. 75,000/- per month from existing Rs. 65,000/- per month w.e.f. 01.04.2022. Differential remuneration / location based incentive for hard to reach areas/health institutions for specialist cadre. The EC recommended that a committee be constituted for examination and submission of recommendations.

4.3:- Regularizition of 6 Nos of works executed for launching of various Govt. programmes

Executive committee recommended the 6 nos. of works executed by NHM for launching of various Govt. programmes as verified and recommended by the committee constituted by the Govt.

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The Chairman, EC suggested to MD-NHM can prepare such list of activities, which have been executed in a quality manner, but payments are not cleared yet, in such cases, payments can be made using the saving fund available under the scheme in this FY, so that no liability is carried forward in next financial year as from next year, no such fund will be available to make such backlog payment.
