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PREFACE

NATIONAL PROGRAMME FOR PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF FLUOROSIS (NPPCF)2021-22.

A. Introduction:- Fluorosis, a public health problem is caused by excess intake of fluoride through drinking water/ food product/ industrial pollutant over a long period of time. It's results in major health disorder.1. Dental fluorosis (affects teeth) 2. Skeletal fluorosis (affects bones) 3. Non- skeletal fluorosis. (affects soft, non- calcified tissues). NPPCF programme is implemented in 7 nos. of districts. The name of districts are- Nagaon, Kamrup, Karbi Anglong, Nalbari, Dhubri, Karimganj & Udalguri.

Desirable limit of fluoride in water is 1 ppm(1 mg/ltr.) Age 0-12 years are more prone to affect.

SOURCES OF FLUORIDE ENTRY TO THE BODY:

- 1. Drinking water and food.
- 2. Inhalation/ingestion from industrial avenues.
- 3. Fluoridated dental products.

PREVENTION:

Fluorosis is a easily preventable disease through practice of interventions.

- Safe fluoride free water
- Diet supplementation.
- Supply of micro nutrient.
- **B.** Objectives of the Programme: To Identify the Dental/Skeletal and non-skeletal Fluorosis patient and differentiate the pain due to Skeletal Fluorosis and other pain. Promoting Nutritious Diet, by Good foods, save drinking water and use of proper cooking method. Apart from that supplementation of multivitamins and minerals to the affected people and refer the fluorosis affected people to tertiary level(GMCH/AMCH) for treatment. Set up of a Fluoride Rehabilitation Centre in fluorosis affected districts.
- C. Key priority areas:
 - a) Time to time survey in the community and school survey in affected areas also in new areas.
 - b) Water sample should collected from all drinking water sources of affected areas.
 - c) Urine sample should be collected from all affected people, identified Dental Fluorosis from survey.
 - d) Diet counselling has to be done for the affected people with help of Counsellor of RBSK/ Nutrition programme.
 - e) Monthly report- The monthly report of all activities under taken alongwith the expenditure incurred at the district level should be sent by the District Nodal Officer to State Cell.
 - f) Quarterly report- The quarterly report has to be sent by the District Nodal Officer in prescribed format which will be examined by the State Nodal officer and will be forwarded to the Central Fluorosis cell, Govt. of India, MOH&FW, New Delhi.
 - g) The Skeletal Fluorosis patient has to be taken for further investigation and treatment at tertiary level health facilities (Medical Collage Hospitals)
 - h) Submission of FMR on or before 7th day of every month. Booked the expenditure in proper FMR code.

- a) Medical treatment is mainly supplementation of micronutrient like Vitamins C & D, Calcium, antioxidants and treatment of malnutrition which will be get from District Drug Warehouse, NHM of respective district. The drugs which are not available under EDL can purchase from allotted fund for the districts.
- b) Treatment of deformity includes physiotherapy, corrective plasters, orthoses (Mobility Aids for skeletal fluorosis cases).
- c) The above mentioned vitamins and minerals supplementation and other treatment will be done as per district wise requirement.
- d) A committee must be form in district for purchase of required Micronutrient and Mobility Aids. The member of the committee should include the Joint Director of Health Services, DNO, District Consultant of NPPCF and DAM/ accounts personal of NPPCF.
- e) Also suspected or confirmed Skeletal Fluorosis patient may be brought to tertiary level (Medical College Hospital) health facilities for reconstructive survey.
- f) The fund for the ongoing districts is approved as follows. The tentative breakup is given below.

Activity: Under this FMR we have purchased vitamin C, zinc, multivitamin etc.(which are not available under EDL, NHM, Assam) and supplied to the victims of affected areas, so that the victims can able to grow their immunity. Therefore the supplementation of above mentioned items are utmost essential. Besides under this head we have provisions to provide walking aid to the skeletal fluorosis patients.

Activity:- Fluoride Nilogon is fluoride removal water filter we have plan to give 200 nos. of house hold in Kamrup Rural district. The total Fluororsis affected population is 17000 nos. and has 1000 nos. affected household. There is no alternative sources of water in these pockets. Initially we have planned for 200 nos. of household. Rs. 1400/- x 200 nos.= **Rs. 2.80 lakhs.**

- 1. This amount is given to set up a 200 nos. of Fluoride Nilogon(Fluoride removal filter) at Kamrup(R) District.
- 2. As alternative sources of water are not available at Kamrup(R) district.

Fluoride Nilogon is a fluoride removal water filter developed by chemical science department Tezpur University. Presently in collaboration with Tezpur University we have adopted this filter in Karbi Anglong district by own expenditure of the victims. Recently the Karbi Anglong Autonomous district council has given this filter approximately 6000 households in collaboration with Art of living. In the year 2020-21, we have adopted 500nos of Fluoride Nilogon at Karimganj district.

By observing the positive result of this filter it is planned to provide the Fluoride Nilogon filters to 200 nos. of house hold at Kamrup(R) district.

The Estimate cost per filter is Rs. 1400/-.(for 100 liters of capacity).

DNO and Consultant of NPPCF is requested to contact with Chemical Science Department of Tezpur University and also requested to coordinate with CCI, Bokajan, Karbi Anglong for lime stone. DNO may take help of any trained NGO(trained on installation and use of Fluoride Nilogon) for purchase, coordinate and installation of filter at selected household.

Grand total Activity budget = Rs. 59.56 lakhs.

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
